## What is phonics?

- •Phonics is one approach in helping children learn to read and spell. It forms part of a set of skills we use to teach children to become readers and writers.
- It teaches children to;
  - listen carefully and identify the sounds that make up each word
  - ❖recognise the sounds that each letter makes
  - ❖identify the sounds that combinations of letters make sh ee
  - blend these sounds together from left to right to read a word sheep
  - **❖** Segment sounds to spell.
- •Being able to read the words is only one part of being a reader (decoding)

# How the sounds are pronounced

 Pronouncing sounds correctly and clearly is key to phonics progress.





## Terminology

Phoneme The smallest unit of sound in a word

Graphemes How the sounds are written (letters)

Digraph 2 letters making 1 sound

Trigraph 3 letters making 1 sound

Split digraph 2 letters making 1 sound but with a letter in between.

Segmenting and blending





### **Year 1 Phonics Screening Check**

- •In the <u>summer term of Year 1</u> the children will take part in the phonics screening check (A Government Assessment).
- •Year 2 children who also achieved below the expected standard will re-take it.
- This is to confirm children have learned sufficient phonic blending and decoding to an appropriate standard.


They will sit with their class teacher, in a quiet area. Each test takes around 10 minutes. However some children may need longer and some children less time. If a child needs a rest or break they can have these and come back to the test later in the day.



- The children will read 20 real words and 20 pseudo-words.
- The pseudo words are included because they are new to all children.
  They do not favour children who may have a good vocabulary
  knowledge or visual memory of words. Children will need to apply their
  phonics knowledge to work them out.
- Many children try to make sense of the alien words. The alien words can cause issues, especially if the child is a competent reader, as they are always looking to make alien words into real words.
- So, included in our phonics sessions, we use real and alien words when learning new sounds, so the children are encouraged to use phonics as the predominant tool when they come across a new word.



- The phonics screening will be taking place during the week commencing 6<sup>th</sup> June 2022.
- If your child doesn't pass the phonics screening check in year 1, they will take it again in the summer term of year 2 2023.

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### **Reporting To Parents**

By the end of the Summer term all schools must report their child's results to parents.

They will also confirm if the child has met the standard threshold.

Children who do not achieve the expected level will retake the test when they are in Year 2.



#### **How Are The Results Used?**

Results from the check will be used by schools to analyse their own performance and for Ofsted to use in inspections.



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## Tips and tricks for home

- Pronounce sounds correctly use your sound mats whenever and wherever possible.
- Use phonics when reading let them have a go first and if they are struggling show them how to do it (use the sound mat to help you)
- Use phonics when writing shopping lists, stories. Don't worry about it being correct as long as you can read it phonetically.
- Some words don't follow normal spelling rules. These are called 'tricky words'. We look for the tricky part in each word so they don't catch us out. Some children find it easier to learn these by sight but we always encourage them to use phonics first.
- Let your child teach you!


#### Please remember....
