


Area of learning	What we will be learning
<p>Communication, Language and Literacy</p>	<div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-between;"> <div style="width: 45%;">  <p>We have been reading the story</p> <p>This week we are learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Write a sequel to the story. <p>We will use verbs in the past tense and add 'ed' endings. We will use time order words e.g. now, next, after that and finally. We will think of our own ideas and become authors!</p> <p>Vocabulary: Verb, noun, sentence, adjective, past tense, time order, sequel.</p> </div> <div style="width: 45%;"> <p>Phonics focus: We will be learning new phase 5 sounds this week. These sounds are called split digraphs as they are split with another grapheme (letter) in between:</p> <p><u>/ai/ a-e shake</u> <u>/igh/ i-e time</u> <u>/oa/ o-e home</u> <u>/oo/ /yoo/ u-e rude cute</u></p> <p>Tricky words could, would, should, our</p> <p>Please practise these at home. You could:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Write them on sticky notes and hide them around the house to read. • Find them in books you are reading. • Write them in a steamed-up mirror. • Rainbow write them using a different coloured pen for each letter. </div> </div>
	<p>Handwriting: We are using lead ins in all our writing and are focusing on lead ins for harder letters:</p> <div style="text-align: center; margin-top: 20px;">  </div>
<p>Mathematical Development</p>	<p>We will continue to learn about addition this week.</p> <p>We will be learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Add more to a number. - Solve addition problems - Find a part. <p>Maths fluency: This week we will be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - continuing to explore how the numbers 6, 7, 8 and 9 can all be composed of two parts where 5 is one of the parts. The focus is still on identifying the composition of these numbers where 5 is a part. <p>Words you might hear your child say! Subitising - when you are able to look at a group of objects and realise how many there are without counting. Part whole - the idea that numbers can be split into parts, which can be used in maths learning Commutative - when 2 numbers can be added or multiplied & the same answer will be found no matter what order they are in. For example: $3 + 2 = 5$, $2 + 3 = 5$; Systematic - Having a pattern or order to the way you work.</p> <p>You can ask your child?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Count different amounts of things around the house. How many are there? Add some more • How many are there now? • What is the total? • What is the addition sentence?

Jigsaw PSED	<p>This term we will be learning about ‘Celebrating Difference’.</p> <p>We are learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Know who to talk to if we feel unhappy or are being bullied. – Be kind to children who are bullied
Geography	<p>This term will be learning about the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom.</p> <p>This week we are learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Name and locate the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom. - Talk about and describe features of landmarks in Wales and Northern Ireland. <p><u>Vocabulary:</u> City, Country, United Kingdom, Wales, Cardiff, Northern Ireland, Belfast</p> <p><u>You can ask your child:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - To tell you about famous landmarks in Wales and Northern Ireland - You can get a map or atlas out and find Wales and Northern Ireland. - What is the capital city of Wales? What can you see there? - What is the capital city of Northern Ireland? What can you see there?
Physical Development	<p>Jenny will lead Friday PE sessions and class teachers will lead sessions on Monday. We will be learning fitness and practising multi-skills.</p>
