| Area of learning | What we will be learning | |
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| Communication, Language and Literacy | Our key text is 'Man on the Moon' | PhonicsWe will be assessing the children over the next two weeks on their Phonics learning.Spellings this week are: replied, sorry, please, shriek, stationTricky word: friend |
| | We will be completing our own stories based on 'Man on the Moon'. We have drafted each part and published as we have gone along. We have spent time editing our drafts and checking for sense, correct punctuation and spelling. We will be publishing the ending this week. We will then be learning to recite and perform a poem in small groups 'Aliens stole my Underpants' by Brian Moses. We will be focusing on using our voices to add interest and putting actions to the verses. Vocabulary: adjective, noun, adverb, past tense, expanded noun phrase, sequence, editing, publish, poem, verse, rhyme. | Please practise these at home. You could: Paint the word Time yourself and see how many times you can write the word in 30 seconds Pyramid write the word Make the word with playdough Chalk the word on the ground Write the word in rainbow writing Please practise them in any other ways that your child might enjoy. We will then review these words each Friday and have a spelling quiz. |
| Mathematical Development | We are continuing to explore addition and subtraction. This week the children will be learning to: Subtract a 1-digit number from a 2-digit number Add two 2-digit numbers without crossing 10 Add two 2-digit numbers by crossing 10. Subtract two 2-digit number without crossing 10. We will be exploring these skills practically, using a variety of manipulatives and developing our use of CPA (Concrete, Pictorial and Abstract). Key Vocabulary Addition, sum, more than, total, plus, altogether, commutative, subtraction, minus, less than, take away, fewer. Questions you might ask your child What does commutative mean? What is the number bond of 10? What can you partition the number into? How many do you need to subtract to get 10? How many more do you need to subtract? What is less than? What is the bond to 10 for? Maths fluency This week, the children will explore the number 10. They will recap number bonds of 10. Children will work systematically to find all the bonds of 10 on the 10-frame and recap that even numbers can be made of 2 odd parts or 2 even parts. Attention will be drawn to the commutative property of addition. When they are secure with these bonds, they can apply them to other number relationships, eg bonds of 20 and 100. Knowing the pairs of numbers that sum to 10 will also help them to develop efficient strategies for calculating. | |
