They are looking at the different expressions that total 9, as well as addition expressions that are 'greater than' or 'less than' 9. Jigsaw We will be continuing our learning about how to work towards a goal, specifically, when we are working together with a team. We will be asking the children to think about what makes a good team member, how they feel when they succeed together, what works well and what doesn't. We will be encouraging the children to apply this to different areas of their likes to support them in developing growth mindsets and resilience. Knowledge and Understanding of the World	RE The children have started our RE learning which is based around rules and routines. So far, we have looked into these terms and our own lives by thinking about the rules we might follow at home, at school and outside in the world. We then considered what routines we have and why routines are helpful. In the following lessons this week we will	

	be continuing to think about rules and routines but across Christianity, Islam and from a Humanist perspective. Key vocabulary

Creative Development	Music	
	In music, we will be developing our skills in performing as a group. We will be focusing on beat and rhythm and making sure that we stay in time together. The past few weeks we have been exploring how to change the structure of music, as well as understanding how we can create different textures by using different instruments at one time. This week, the children will be combining the different skills that they have learnt so far.

Physical Development	Jenny will lead our Tuesday PE sessions and class teachers will lead sessions on Thursday. We will be learning gymnastics skills and exploring a variety of dance moves.
