







Reading books

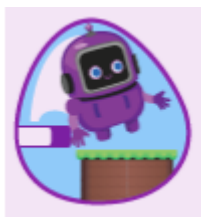
