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## What will we be learning this week?

Area of learning	What are we learning?	Possible activities and ideas
Communication & Language and Literacy (English)	Writing  - To add the suffix 'ing' to words	We are learning to add 'ing' to words, for example 'jump' becomes 'jumping'. Work through the activity PDF together.
		Children think of your own sentences using 'ing' words to describe some of the activities you have been doing at home or plan to do over the next few weeks.
		Here are some things your teachers have been doing and the sentences they have made up.
		<ul> <li>I have been dancing in my kitchen.</li> <li>I have been eating chocolate.</li> <li>I have been talking with my friends and family.</li> <li>I have been watching Disney films.</li> </ul>
		There is also a sheet attached to complete if you would like.
	- To use the spelling rule for adding 's' to a verb.	We will be learning to 's' to verbs (doing words). We will know when to add 's' to verbs in the third person. We will understand that verbs change when writing in the 3 <sup>rd</sup> person. For example:
		<ul> <li>'I eat cake' is written in the 1<sup>st</sup> person.</li> <li>What happens when we add he/she/ 'she eats cake'- third person. We have to add 's'!</li> </ul>
		Using the words below- can you write a sentence in the first person and then in the 3 <sup>rd</sup> person. For example:
		I like sweets.
		She likes sweets.
		Can you challenge yourself do write 4 sentences?

## **Phonics Learning WC 30.3.20**

\*Red words are words that are not spelt how they sound.

Learning	Words
Activity 1 – Alphabet practise – sing the traditional alphabet song.  Play 'Alphabet bounce' – bounce a ball up and down or across to each other, whilst saying each letter of the alphabet in order. If you make a mistake or drop the ball you must start from the beginning!	*RED WORDS TO PRACTISE & LEARN: I, the, he, she, we, me, be Read them, write them out with a spiky red shape around them, or put them into a sentence
Activity 2 – Practising letter names. Talk about the sound each letter makes (it's phoneme) - you could use the Song of Sounds song to do this. Sing the traditional alphabet song and say all the names of the letters. E.g. 'My name is A and my sound is /a/; My name is B and my sound is /b/	RED WORDS TO PRACTISE & LEARN: come, some, said, have, many, any Read them, write them out with a spiky red shape around them, or put them into a sentence
Activity 3 – Practise writing out the alphabet using upper (capital) and lower (small) case letters. Use chalk outside, paint, glitter and glue, pen and paper, whatever you like to keep practising this skill. E.g. Aa, Bb, Cc	RED WORDS TO PRACTISE & LEARN: oh, again, one, once, their, there, little, ask Read them, write them out with a spiky red shape around them, or put them into a sentence
Activity 4- Alphabet practise – sing the traditional alphabet song. Play 'Alphabet tennis' – mime hitting a ball with a tennis racket, whilst saying each letter of the alphabet in order. If you make a mistake, the ball has dropped & you must start from the beginning!	RED WORDS TO PRACTISE & LEARN: when, what, why, which, where, were, who, how Read them, write them out with a spiky red shape around them, or put them into a sentence
Activity 5 - Practising letter names. Talk about the sound each letter makes (it's phoneme) - you could use the Song of Sounds song to do this. Sing the traditional alphabet song and say all the names of the letters. E.g. 'My name is A and my sound is /a/; My name is B and my sound is /b/	RED WORDS TO PRACTISE & LEARN: of, off, house, because, looked, called Read them, write them out with a spiky red shape around them, or put them into a sentence

Look at the list of following words. Can you put them in alphabetical order?

Try writing them on bits of paper and then rearranging you can take a photo and email it to us or write them in your home learning book. Don't forgot to use your lovely year 1 handwriting!
