

Multiplication Reasoning Chilli Challenges!

Please note these sheets do not need to be printed off. You can write them out on paper or simply show your child on a screen. They need to show their working out on another bit of paper.

Mild

A gardener plants 2 rows of daffodil bulbs, and plants 5 in each row. How many daffodils will they have?

Gina and Milly share out a bagful of cherries. They each have 9 cherries. How many were there in the bag altogether?

I buy a packet of chocolate biscuits. I eat two biscuits each day. The biscuits last for 8 days. How many biscuits were in the packet?



I find 6 pairs of gloves in a drawer. How many gloves are there altogether?

How many days are in 2 weeks?

How about 4 weeks?

Show your working out.

Medium

A gardener plants 5 rows of daffodil bulbs, and plants 6 in each row. How many daffodils will they have?

Gina and Milly equally shared out a bagful of cherries. There was one left over. Both girls had 12 cherries.

How many cherries would have been in the bag?

I have 30 seeds and 5 plant pots. If I use the same number of seeds in each pot, how many seeds will I plant in each pot?

How many minutes are there in 2 hours?



How many minutes are there in $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours?

Show your working out.



A box contains 5 rubbers. 30 children are given a rubber each. How many boxes of rubbers are needed?

Miss Sands has 2 packs of pens with 10 in each. How many pens are there in total?

Fred has 5 plant pots with 5 sunflower seeds in each. How many sunflowers will grow in total?

Spicy

A gardener plants 5 rows of daffodil bulbs, and plants 9 in each row. How many daffodils will they have?

Gin, Tim, Ben and Milly equally shared out a bagful of cherries. There was one left over. They each had 4 cherries.

How many cherries have been in the bag?

How many minutes are there in 3 hours?

Seven groups of 10 children go on a trip to the museum. How many children go on the trip?



How many minutes are there in $3\frac{1}{2}$ hours?

Show your working out.

Mrs Nash thinks that $2 \times 9 = 19$. Mrs Brown thinks that $2 \times 9 = 18$. Who is correct and why? Show your working and write a sentence to explain your reasoning.

Cam has 7 packets of ice lollies. There are 3 lollies in each packet. How many are there in total?

Jamie wants to go to the fair. He needs £1 to enter. How many 10p's does he need to make £1? What would the multiplication sentence be?

Tim has 3 boxes of eggs with 6 in each. Jess has 5 boxes of eggs with 4 in each. Who has more eggs?
